



Again, Happy Easter! OK, we are a week later but the spirit of this phenomenal moment in our lives is still specially upon me! The scriptures passages this past week have helped keep me "alive in the moment of the resurrection!"

Think of it again (as did our spiritual ancestors discovering the empty tomb): If this truly did happen (and, Hello, we know it did), then, certainly, all the other things He told us would also be true! So read backwards in the bible and relish in all of that! Forgiveness, resurrection, and life beyond this earthly moment of life are just a few of the delights! How can this not excite you?!?!

And today is Divine Mercy Sunday! You deserve to know and take advantage of this! On February 22, 1931, a young Polish nun, Sr. Faustina Kowalska, saw a vision of Jesus with rays of mercy streaming from the area of His heart. And He ordered her to begin writing a diary so others would learn to trust in Him. Then in a series of revelations, He taught her that His mercy is unlimited and available even to the greatest sinners, and He revealed special ways for His people to respond to His mercy.

Our Lord told St. Faustina: "My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day all the divine floodgates through which graces flow are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near Me, even though its sins be as scarlet... The Feast of Mercy emerged from My very depths of tenderness. It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the fount of My mercy."

This means a complete pardon and, as such, the need to spend time in purgatory. In other words, those who make a good confession (seven days before or after this feast day of Divine Mercy -today) and receive Communion today will be returned to the state of total purity that existed at the time they were Baptized. And thanks to Pope John Paul II, the Church also gives who do so a plenary indulgence. Please do not let this special opportunity slip by. Confession before Mass is available throughout this week. Call me if you need to schedule a special time.

Our Lord also said to Sr. Faustina: "My daughter, write that the greater the misery of a soul, the greater it's right to My mercy; (urge) all souls to trust in the unfathomable abyss of My mercy, because I want to save them all. On the cross, the fountain of My mercy was opened wide by the lance for all souls – no one have I excluded! The greater the sinner, the greater the right he has to My mercy."

What more can I say! Except....YES, thanks once again to our Liturgy Committee, parish and office staff, and so many other volunteers who helped make the Liturgies of Holy Week and Easter so beautifully memorable for all of us! Happy Easter! Happy Divine Mercy Sunday!

Mary Faustina Kowalska

Sister Mary Faustina was born on August 24, 1905 in Głogowiec, Poland and was baptized Helena. On August 1, 1925, she entered the Congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy and took the name of Sister Mary Faustina. She died from tuberculosis in

Krakow, Poland at the age of thirty-three on October 5, 1938.
