

Dear Parishioners and Friends of Sacred Heart,

Today's gospel of John is mysteriously rich and symbolically revealing. It implies that Peter and other disciples already left Jerusalem and returned to their hometown (Galilee) to resume their former way of life as fishermen. After a nightlong fishing, they came in absolutely empty-handed. They forgot the words of Jesus: "Without me, you can do nothing." It is now early morning. Tired and self-defeated, they follow the risen Jesus Christ's instruction, "Cast the net over the right side of the boat." Lo and behold, they caught so many fish, to the point of unable to pull the net into the boat. The net was exceedingly stretched yet not torn apart.

In essence, Peter and the early disciples discovered a new, life-giving vocation/mission with the resurrected Christ. Returning to their former way of life (i.e., self-centered denial, fearful running away) without Jesus only yields them empty-handed. But casting our net into the water (i.e., living our faith in the world, sharing God-given gifts) according to the way of Christ produces life – plenty of it! Admittedly the net would be stretched (i.e., faith be tested, sacrifices) but the grace of Resurrection will keep it intact with a great catch (i.e., joy, meaning, salvation). The key is to "cast our net" of faith, not based on sinful past but with hope-filled love, as the risen Jesus purposely ignores the three denials of Peter and gently draws out his abiding love for him and for his vulnerable people (i.e., feed my lambs, tend my sheep).

Peter is a stand-in for you and me today. The question Jesus asks repeatedly of Peter – "do you love me? – is meant to us as well. Please prayerfully reflect on the last sentence. In a couple of weeks our Sacred Heart community of faith will join every parish in the Archdiocese to begin an Annual Catholic Appeal. It is one concrete, practical response to the above question from Jesus to each of us.

May the Risen Christ continue to fill you and your extended family with his divine love! Fr. Binh Ta, C.Ss.R.
