

Dear Parishioners and Friends of Sacred Heart,

On every fourth weekend of Easter, known as the Good Shepherd Sunday and the World Day of Prayer for Vocations, we implore the Risen Christ to transform each of us into a good shepherd, after his own heart. Being a Christ-like good shepherd – "knowing" who/what entrusted to our care, nurturing, leading, protecting, etc. – is our baptized vocation or calling, as a priest or parent or teacher or bus driver or police officer, etc. Each calling is unique and mutually complimentary to the others. Our vocation, first and foremost, is to seek the face of God and to serve as Jesus Christ has done, that is, to live our particular calling with fidelity and generosity. Each vocation is personal, yet never self-serving. Rather, it's always meant to serve common good. What a sacred gift and challenge ... a life worth living!

A lady recently said: "I pray for our Church daily, especially in this age of vocation crisis!" I appreciate and understood her well-intention. Yet, strictly speaking, baptized vocations are not in crisis, since the Holy Spirit has already gifted/entrusted to each of us a vocation. We don't pray for more vocations. Rather we are praying to be attentively aware of our unique, sacred callings.

On this day, we pray, in particular, for the vocations of ordained priesthood and religious life. And, those of us who are being called to this beautiful way of life will generously, courageously respond to God's call. With that, I offer you a prayer by St. Ignatius of Loyola:

Dear Jesus, teach me to be generous; to love and serve you as you deserve; to give and not to count the cost; to fight and not to heed the wounds; to toil and not to seek for rest; to labor and to look for no reward, except that of knowing that I do your holy will. Amen
