

With the grace of God, the guidance of the Holy Spirit, and the maternal protection of Our Mother of Perpetual Help, we devote ourselves to living this mission. Dear Parishioners and Friends of Sacred Heart,

Today Jesus asks His disciples a pointed question, "Who do you say that I am?" (Matthew 16:16) Such an inquiry, at first sight, seems like Jesus is facing an "identity crisis," that He is in need of identity clarification or affirmation. With prayerful reflection, however, this question is really meant for the disciples. Jesus asks, after having shown them miraculous feeding of the homeless, rescued Peter from sinking, and taught them how to live with faith-filled integrity (14:13 - 16:12). And He poses that question as they are walking towards Jerusalem, where He will face oppositions, death, and eventual resurrection. In asking His disciples, "Who do you say that I am," Jesus prepares them to clarify their level of commitment to Him by faith, and to live out what Jesus has been teaching them by words and examples. In short, the disciples individually and collectively have to own their faith in following Jesus.

The same question put to Peter and other disciples in years past is also put to each of us today. We face this question, "Who do I say Jesus is?" when we need to choose between living right or wrong. As we mature in years, this question invites us to practice Gospel values on the choices we make. Being baptized or confirmed is only the first step of living faith. Just coasting on our faith virtually amounts to a spiritual coma. Eventually each of us needs to "own" the faith we received from our family and our church. As we respond to "Who do you say that I am?" from Jesus with heart and exemplify our response by self-giving kindness, then we will know Jesus, no longer as an obligation or outsider, but as the living God and a soul mate for our life journey.

This past Thursday the Pastoral Council, including Fr. Mark and Fr. Binh, met to map out ways of responding – together as a parish – to the question of Jesus, "Who do you say that I am?" in forming a direction, the council wants to hear from you. Fr. Richard Ochiltree, died July 9 at St. Clement Health Care Center in Liguori, Missouri. A Memorial Mass will be celebrated on Monday, August 22 at 12:10pm at Sacred Heart Church.

Born in Seattle on Aug. 4, 1927 with his fraternal twin brother Robert, Fr. Ochiltree graduated from Sacred Heart School. He entered the Redemptorists after grade school, professed perpetual vows in 1951, and was ordained to the priesthood in June 29, 1953.

Fr. Ochiltree served as a seminary teacher, parish priest, and retreat leader during almost six decades in the priesthood. A man who held a master's degree in English, he was especially known for his love of literature, particularly his knowledge of Shakespeare and the Gospel of John. He was also known for his strong devotion to Mary.
