



Dear Parishioners,



This coming week the Redemptorists have some distinguished visitors coming to town. They will be with us on Thursday and Friday of this coming week. Who are they, and why are they coming to Seattle?

Every six years to eight years, our superiors in Rome send a delegation to each of the houses in our Congregation throughout the world. We are in about 70 countries around the globe. This keeps the men in Rome knowledgeable of what is going on in each Redemptorist community, and gives the local men a chance to hear what is going on in all the other Redemptorist communities around the world. Basically, it keeps us all tied together in carrying out the purpose of the Redemptorist mission in each community.

Our Congregation is divided into what we call Provinces. In North America we are the Denver Province: the Midwest, Central Southern States, and the West Coast States; the Baltimore Province: the Eastern States and the English speaking Caribbean; and the Vice Province of Richmond: the Eastern Southern States. In Canada, we have the Edmonton/Toronto Province: all of English speaking Canada; the Quebec Province: French Canada; and finally the Yorkton Province: the Ukrainian Rite communities of Canada and the U.S.A. We have divided our Congregation into 5 Regions – for having a representative on the General Council in Rome: North America, South America, Europe, Africa, and Asia/Oceania.

The men who will be visiting us this coming week are the Roman Consultors from North America (Brother Jeffrey Rolle, C.Ss.R.) and Asia/Oceania (Father Juvy Andrade, C.Ss.R.). Brother Jeffrey Rolle is from Dominica – in the Caribbean. He is the first Brother to be a General Consultor in the history of our Congregation. Father Juvy Andrade comes from the Indian Province of Bangalore.

As you can see – we are definitely an International Congregation in the Church. We will try to give these visitors a good example of Redemptorist life and ministry in the U.S.A. – and they will try to bring home to us the concerns and challenges in ministry of other Provinces in our Congregation. This is what ties us together as a family – united to bring the message of redemption to our people in the spirit of St. Alphonsus, our founder.

I want to take this occasion to thank everyone in our parish here at Sacred Heart for the support, prayers, and assistance you have given the Redemptorists these past one hundred and twenty one years. This is our oldest foundation on the West Coast – and we are very happy to be serving all you in any way we can.
