



Last weekend, I really had a good time with my family in Austin, Texas. Every evening, my brothers and sisters' families gathered at my parent's house for dinner, prayers, and entertainment. We had a great time with one another. I would like to thank all of you for your nice wishes to me on the Lunar Vietnamese New Year.

This Sunday is the Sixth Sunday in the Ordinary Time. The Scripture readings are all about God's law and our choices. God's law calls us to live a right relationship with God and with one another. Our choices of living God's law will bring us fullness of life, goodness, and justice with God and with one another. May the Holy Spirit help us make choices that lead to the fullness of life.

This Sunday is also World Marriage Day. It honors the faithfulness and joy of daily marriage life. The history of World Marriage Day began in Baton Rouge, LA in 1981 when married couples encouraged the mayor, the governor, and the Bishop to proclaim St. Valentines Day as "We Believe in Marriage Day." In 1982, 43 Governors officially proclaimed the second Sunday of February as "We Believe in Marriage Day" and celebrations spread to U.S. military bases in several foreign countries. In 1983, the name was changed to "World Marriage Day". In 1993, the Great Pope John Paul II imparted his Apostolic Blessings on World Marriage Day. The theme of this day is "Love One Another." This phrase is the commandment given to us by Jesus in the Gospel of John, chapter 15, verse 12. Today, we thank and honor husbands and wives who are the living signs of God's love to us in their lifelong commitment of marriage. We also wish and pray that they continue to make the daily decision to love one another.

I would like to conclude with a story from the Guideposts, America's Favorite Inspiration Magazine:

"When I was a boy, my father, a baker, introduced me to the wonders of song," tenor Luciano Pavarotti relates. "He urged me to work very hard to develop my voice. Arrigo Pola, a professional tenor in my hometown of Modena, Italy, took me as a pupil. I also enrolled in a teachers college. On graduating, I asked my father, Shall I be a teacher or a singer?" "Luciano," my father replied, "if you try to sit on two chairs, you will fall between them. For life, you must choose one chair." "I chose one. It took seven years of study and frustration before I made my first professional appearance. It took another seven to reach the Metropolitan Opera. And now I think whether it's laying bricks, writing a book --whatever we choose--we should give ourselves to it. Commitment, that's the key. Choose one chair." (www.sermonillustration.com)

Pope Benedict XVI approved a miracle attributed to Pope John Paul II's intercession, clearing the way for the late pope's beatification on May 1, Divine Mercy Sunday.

Divine Mercy Sunday had special significance for Pope John Paul, who made it a church-wide feast day to be celebrated a week after Easter. The pope died on the vigil of Divine Mercy Sunday in 2005.

Pope Benedict's action followed more than five years of investigation into the life and writings of the Polish pontiff, who died in April 2005 after more than 26 years as pope.

The Vatican said it took special care with verification of the miracle, the spontaneous cure of a French nun from Parkinson's disease -- the same illness that afflicted Pope John Paul in his final years.

With beatification, Pope John Paul will be declared "blessed" and thus worthy of restricted liturgical honor. Another miracle is needed for canonization, by which the church declares a person to be a saint and worthy of universal veneration.
