Dear Parishioners,

The month of March is coming.

In the United States, March is National Women's History month. In this month, we pray that all nations may recognize the dignity inherent in all peoples. We also pray for an end to sexism and exploitation of women.

In the Church calendar, March is dedicated to Saint Joseph. We don't hear much about him except what is mentioned in the Gospel. He was the husband of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the foster-father of Jesus. The Gospel proclaims him as a man of righteousness in his relationship with God and people. In addition, He was a man of few words but utter fidelity, courage and reliability. In 1870 Pope Pius IX solemnly proclaimed the legal father of Jesus as Patron of the Universal Church. He is also the patron of the fathers, carpenters, social justice, and of the dying because he died with Jesus and Mary close to him, the way we would like to leave this earthly world to our heavenly home. In the month of March, the Church encourages us to be devoted to Saint Joseph and pays special attention to his life and example.

Pope John Paul II in his 1989 Apostolic Exhortation *Redemptoris Custos* (Guardian of the Redeemer) states that "all may grow in devotion to the Patron of the Universal Church and in love for the Savior whom he served in such an exemplary manner ... In this way the whole Christian people not only will turn to Saint Joseph with greater fervor and invoke his patronage with trust, but also will always keep before their eyes his humble, mature way of serving and of "taking part" in the plan of salvation."

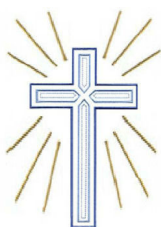
