



Dear Parishioners and Friends of Sacred Heart of Jesus Parish,

Last Sunday, the new appointment for the Redemptorists of the Denver Province was issued. Fr. Binh Thanh Ta, C.Ss.R. is the new Pastor of Sacred Heart of Jesus Parish. Fr. Mark Scheffler, C.Ss.R. is a Parochial Vicar. Fr. Binh was my formator during my theological studying years in Chicago, Illinois. He is currently the chaplain for Rice University in Houston, Texas. He will be here on the second week of August. Fr. Mark was the vocation director during my philosophy studying years in San Antonio, Texas. He is currently the director of the St. Clement Health Care Center in St. Louis, Missouri for the senior Redemptorists. He will probably be here on the last week of July. Fr. Bill Cleary will still be in Seattle to help out with different parishes. My new appointment is in Biloxi, Mississippi. I'm going to serve both Vietnamese and English speaking communities. I will leave Seattle for Biloxi in the middle of August. During this time of transition, I invite you to pray for the Redemptorists in transition and also for our parish.

We were supposed to have the Peter's Pence Collection last Sunday. I postponed it to next Sunday, July 10 since we have not yet achieved our Annual Catholic Appeal goal of \$44,252. We still need \$3,102. This Sunday, I once again invite those who have not pledged or participated to give one dollar a day or \$365.00. The parish needs the participation of each parishioner to achieve the goal of \$44,252. On July 10, we will have a second collection for the Peter's Pence Collection to support the charitable works of the Holy Father, Pope Benedict XVI and provide emergency assistance to those most in need, including victims of oppression, natural disaster, and war. I ask for your generosity to support the Annual Catholic Appeal and the Peter's Pence Collection.

After our 50 day Easter celebration and the solemnities, we come to the Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. We have seen the glory and power of the Lord during Easter and the solemnities. The Scripture readings for this Sunday lead us to learn from Jesus who is meek and humble of heart.


"The overriding disposition of these readings is humility. Jesus, the human manifestation of the divine, is meek and humble. This tells us something else about God. It tells us that high station does not result in pride. On the contrary, Jesus is humble; the king depicted in the reading from Zechariah is humble; the true disciple is called to be humble. A second disposition is placed before us: grateful praise. We turn again to the psalm, and we praise and bless God; we extol God's holy name. In Jesus we have known the tender touch of God, and we are grateful."

Pope Celebrates 60 Years as a Priest

The pope has commemorated his 60th anniversary as a priest with a mass in St. Peter's Basilica. On this feast day of Saints Peter and Paul, the pope receives the newest archbishops and presents each one with a pallium. The pallium is a white scarf made of wool that carries six black crosses. It symbolizes each archbishop's unity with the pope.

Pope Benedict said "It reminds us of Him who took the lamb - humanity - me - upon His shoulders, in order to carry me home. It thus reminds us that we too, as shepherds in His service, are to carry others with us, taking them as it were upon our shoulders and bringing them to Christ."

This year 40 archbishops took part in the ceremony. Among them was James Sartain of Seattle.***
