

Dear Parishioners and Friends of Sacred Heart of Jesus Parish,

The last day of July is exactly my fourth year at Sacred Heart of Jesus Parish in Seattle. I came to Seattle with two suitcases, knew no one, and had no experience of being a parish priest at all. Now I leave Seattle for Biloxi, Mississippi with the same two suitcases, plus two boxes, some email addresses, phone numbers, home addresses, and some wonderful experiences. However,

suitcases, boxes, and the other things are not the most important things which I will bring to the new place. The most essential things I am bringing with me are your constant prayers, hospitality, and acceptance.

I remember my first Mass at Sacred Heart in 2007. One senior parishioner approached me and said, "A few years ago, we had a Vietnamese priest here who could not speak English well. We hardly understood him. How is your English?' I responded to her, "My English is worse than that Vietnamese priest." Right after the Mass, she came to me again and said, "Father, your English is better!" Since that time, she and I became good friends. I know many times you could not understand my English but you continued to accept me and let me serve your parish. I really appreciate your patience and acceptance of my broken English and accent during these four years.


We all know that language is the bridge to bring people together. But this language barrier between us never prevented us to come together to proclaim the Good News of Jesus, to celebrate the Sacraments, and to reach out to the needy. Our faith in God who is merciful and gracious, slow to anger and abounding in kindness and fidelity brings us together. Eucharist brings us together. And the language we speak in the assembly gathering in the Eucharist is the language of love. Sacred Heart of Jesus Parish indeed speaks this language of love.

Recently, one parishioner said to me, "Father, I pray for you all the time." I said to her, "Thank you and please keep praying for me for I really need your prayers." I know during my four years here, many of you offer prayers for me either in the Mass intentions or in your private prayers. I am grateful for that.

From the bottom of my heart, I would like to say "THANK YOU" to all of you, the faithful parishioners of Sacred Heart Parish for many blessed things we have shared and done together. I'm also thankful for being a part of your faith-lived journey during these four years. My parents used to say to me: "wherever you go, you are doing God's work." Thank you again for allowing me to do God's work here in Sacred Heart Parish. Please keep praying for me as I pray for you that wherever we are; we are always doing God's work.
