

Offices Dear Parishioners and Friends of Sacred Heart of Jesus Parish,

Summer has begun last Tuesday. The Alaska cruise ships have also begun few weeks ago. In our Church, we have many visitors who celebrate the Eucharist with us. Let us welcome them with our hospitality and openness. On behalf of Sacred Heart Parish, I would like to welcome all our visitors. May you have a wonderful time in Seattle or on your cruise.

As I write this bulletin, the new assignment for the Redemptorists in the Denver Province has not come out yet. I know many parishioners want to know who will be our new Pastor. I ask you to be patient for a few more days and for sure you will know who the new Pastor will be on the next Sunday bulletin or on the Parish website: www.sacredheartseattle.com.

I am sad to announce to you that our parish has not yet achieved the goal of \$44,252 for the Annual Catholic Appeal. After 6 weeks of this campaign, only 139 out of 440 households participated with the average gift amount of \$267. We really need the other **301 households** to participate in the Appeal. I imagine that if each of the 301 households pledges \$365 then we will have an additional \$109,865 (301x365). We can achieve our goal and the parish will still have some extra funds to finish the basement or have an elevator for the senior parishioners. I once again invite you and the other 301 households to participate or pledge \$365 to help the parish achieve our goal. This Sunday, we celebrate the solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. Let me share with you some words of this solemnity from the Preaching the New Lectionary, year A by Sr. Dianne Bergant and Fr. Richard Fragomeni

God Who Feeds

Our God is a God who feeds. In the past God set a table in freedom and then provided food that enabled our ancestors to survive. They may not have been deserving of God's care, but they were hungry and were threatened with extinction, and God came to their aid. God feeds those who are needy, not those who claim to be worthy. Jesus offered sustenance to the crowds that gathered around him. It was not manna from heaven he offered but his own flesh and blood as food and drink. As with the Israelites in the wilderness, there was skepticism. However, the Israelites eventually recognized God's goodness in the bread from heaven, while many in the crowds that came to Jesus were scandalized by his offer.

Today we are offered the real bread from heaven, Jesus' flesh and blood as food and drink, the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. This food and drink not only sustain life, they are the pledge of eternal life. As in the wilderness and at the time of Jesus, faith is required to realize this is indeed food sent from God as a guarantee of life.

Jesus Christ appeared to Margaret Mary Alacoque in the 17th century and this is one of the blessings He promised to those who practice devotion to His Sacred Heart:

"In the excess of the mercy of my Heart,
I promise you that my all powerful love
will grant to all those who will receive Communion
on the First Fridays, for nine consecutive months,
the grace of final repentance:
they will not die in my displeasure,
nor without receiving the sacraments;
and my Heart will be their secure refuge
in that last hour."
