With that in mind...it would seem to me to be a good time for HOUSE CLEANING...be it our home and yard, or our spiritual life. We have seven weeks to do something in our lives that will make a difference.


As I see it, many people take on "idealistic" programs for Lent, and in a matter of a few days to a few weeks - it falls apart. Be realistic in your Lenten practices - and then maybe something good will come about in your spiritual life. I always think of the folks who used to give up smoking or candy for Lent, and in a matter of a few days, everyone in the house was asking them to drop it...as you couldn't live with them.

Instead of "giving up" something this Lent. I would suggest that you consider "doing" something this Lent...something that you have been putting off for some time now, because it would be difficult, embarrassing, or maybe you just can't seem to put it all together to do it. If you think about it, you will probably find there are quite a few of those items in your life-time catalogue. I am thinking of examples like: visiting someone in a nursing home; writing a letter or making a phone call to someone who you "should" have contacted long ago; cleaning out your closet of the clothes that you have not worn in over a year and giving them to St. Vincent de Paul so someone else can get some use out of them; offering to take some disabled person to church on a Sunday; having someone over for dinner who is living alone. There are all kinds of things that you could do - that really are not impossible and you do intend to do them one of these days. Now is the time to act.

The Gospel this Sunday talks about the temptations of the Lord. Well, we are all quite familiar with such things. In one of St. Paul's letters, he tells us how he was tempted and he begged the Lord to take the temptations away. The response he got was: "MY GRACE IS SUFFICIENT." That is the same answer we will get also. It is a matter of doing something about it...early on. You know what they say about little boys: "If you play with fire, you are going to get burnt".

So let us make this Lent something practical and realistic in our lives and Easter will truly be a day of rejoicing.

St. Patrick - March 17

Patrick was born around 385 in Scotland. His parents were Romans who were in charge of the colonies in Britain.

When he was 14, he was captured by a raiding party and was taken to Ireland as a slave to herd sheep. Ireland at this time was a land of Druids and pagans.

Escaping at age 20, he returned to his family and began studying for the priesthood. He preached throughout Ireland, converting many for 40 years. He died at Saul, Downpatrick, Ireland, site of the first church he built. March 17 is a day for offering prayers for missionaries worldwide.
