



Dear Parishioners,

We are living our daily life in the season of grace and repentance and of renewal of our baptismal promises. In the mind of the Church, Lent is not a gloomy season, but is a joyful season: a time for new life to appear and old attitudes to disappear, and a time to celebrate the paschal mystery of Christ's death and resurrection.

On the Second Sunday of Lent, we hear about the Transfiguration of the Lord. This account is so significant that it is remembered twice in the Church's calendar: on the Second Sunday of Lent and on August 6, the feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord. The source book for Sundays, Seasons, and Weekdays of 2011 tells us about this significant account that is remembered twice in one year: "in August, the Transfiguration of the Lord offers us a glimpse of the glory that the Church will share, when it is transfigured in His image. Today, we view the Transfiguration from a different perspective—the vision of Christ in glory helps us to understand that only by the path of suffering can we come to the glory of Easter." May the account of the Transfiguration of the Lord Jesus, our Savior strengthen us to resist the temptation of despair when we are dealing with our suffering of any kind.

Last Wednesday evening, Catechumen, Christian Wong, and his Sponsor from our parish attended the Rite of Election at Saint James Cathedral. Our Candidates: Michael Wiegand and his wife Leigh-Ann Wiegand could not attend due to their young daughter's sickness. The Rite of Election is to begin the final stage of their journey, which is called purification and enlightenment. Christian Wong will receive baptism at this Easter Vigil. Michael Wiegand and his wife Leigh-Ann (baptized Christians) will also be received into the Catholic Church at this Easter Vigil. In the meantime, they continue to learn about Catholicism every Tuesday evening in our parish. Please keep them in your prayers.

Let me conclude this letter with a story from Our Daily Bread:

A famous evangelist told the following incident: I have a friend who in a time of business recession lost his job, a sizable fortune, and his beautiful home. To add to his sorrow, his precious wife died; yet he tenaciously held to his faith -- the only thing he had left. One day when he was out walking in search of employment, he stopped to watch some men who were doing stonework on a large church. One of them was chiseling a triangular piece of rock. 'Where are you going to put that?' he asked. The man said, 'Do you see that little opening up there near the spire? Well, I'm shaping this stone down here so that it will fit up there.' Tears filled my friend's eyes as he walked away, for the Lord had spoken to him through that laborer whose words gave new meaning to his troubled situation. (Sermon Illustrations)

Japanese Bishop: "We Must Take Courage"

"The Church in Japan will respond to the tragedy of the earthquake and tsunami that struck northern Japan with prayer and solidarity," said Bishop Marcellinus Daiji Tani of Saitama, responding to the March 11 disaster that has claimed over 10,000 victims. "We must take courage, with the help of the Holy Spirit."

"This sad event reminds us that life is in the hands of God and that life is a gift from God," he added. "It will be a challenge for all of us to practice and witness to the commandment of love and brotherly love, in this time of Lent."

"...this painful event may be an opportunity to spread the values of the Gospel...If, with our work and our witness, we can communicate that, then from this evil will come good." said Father Daisuke Narui, Caritas Japan's executive director.
