

Dear Parishioners,

The Parish office has received back some rice bowls and envelopes for Catholic Relief Service (CRS). Most of us are familiar with the rice bowl program which is sponsored every year by CRS during the Lenten season. Today, more than 14,000 parishes, faith communities, and schools

across the United States participate in Operation Rice Bowl as a way to respect human dignity and foster solidarity with our poor brothers and sisters around the world. Our Parish began this program from Ash Wednesday and will conclude it on Holy Thursday (March 21). Many parishioners have brought home the cardboard box that fold into a small bowl. The premise is to fast by eating a simple meal or skipping a snack or coffee break during the day and placing the money saved into the rice bowl. The money from the rice bowl will fund development projects to help the poor people in Haiti, Indonesia, Senegal, Honduras, Kenya, and elsewhere. If you do not have the rice bowl, you can use a plastic bag to put your money in. It is never too late to do meaningful things for our poor brothers and sisters. No matter how much you save and share, it will greatly impact our brothers' and sisters' lives. Rice bowls will be collected from the weekend of Palm Sunday (April 16-17) and throughout the Holy Week in our parish.

This weekend, you will not see Fr. Bill Cleary around because he will be in Vancouver, WA with his family to celebrate his 75th birthday and his niece's 25th Wedding Anniversary. We wish him a belated happy birthday and a good time with his family.

Fr. Konen and Fr. Maiser will celebrate the Eucharist with us this Sunday. Even though they are so busy helping out at different parishes, they can still spare time with our parish. We would like to thank Fr. Konen and Fr. Maiser and all Redemptorists in-residence for your great love and service to Sacred Heart Parish and God's people in the Archdiocese of Seattle. Letting Go

During your prayer time, open your hands and surrender all the important treasures and relationships of your life to God. Spend time expressing your gratitude to God for each gift and relationship. What does the perspective of "all is on loan" say to you in your present relationships

and in your present circumstances? Find concrete ways to express this "open hands" generosity.
