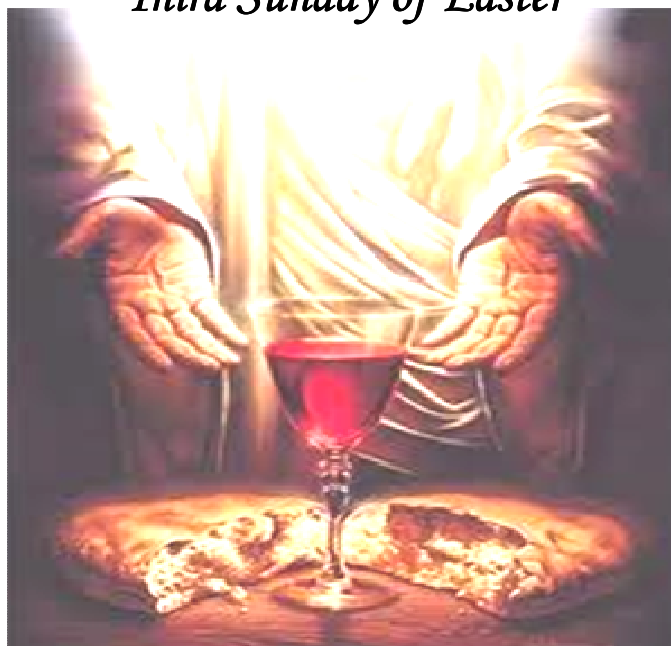

Dear Parishioners and Friends of Sacred Heart of Jesus Parish,

We continue to celebrate the Resurrection of the Lord with joyful and peaceful hearts. Today's Gospel speaks of the account of the two disciples on the journey to Emmaus after the suffering and death of Jesus. They were sad and disappointed about what happened to their teacher and their lives. Jesus appeared to them, accompanied them on the journey to Emmaus, and He opened their hearts and minds to recognize Him as the risen Christ by the Scripture and the breaking of the bread. The lives of the disciples were transformed by their encounter with the risen Christ.

The same is true for us today. We are on the journey of life. If we welcome the risen Christ to journey with us, accompany us, and help us on the journey of life; then we will be transformed and become witnesses of the risen Christ. Dominican Sister Dianne Bergant and Father Richard Fragomeni state in the Preaching the New Lectionary Year A that *"life is not a static reality but rather a movement from one point to another. It is not so much that we make the journey but that we join one already in progress. We join those who have gone before us, those who have forged a path, those who have discovered the dark valleys as well as the places of refreshment. Even the unfolding of our religious tradition can be characterized as a journey. It is the path of meaning that we take throughout life. We are not on this journey alone. We have companions with whom we can discuss all that has occurred. In fact, we need each other. We cannot journey alone. We need their encouragement and support; we need their talents and insight; we need their company. Journey is a rich and challenging metaphor for life."*

We need each other on the journey of life. Other people also need us on their journey of life, especially the needy and most abandoned. This Sunday, we begin the Annual Catholic Appeal. The Annual Catholic Appeal is about being Catholic and joining thousands of other Catholics in Western Washington to share our treasure to carry out the mission of God. Your pledge to the Annual Catholic Appeal is a one-stop donation for over 60 ministries and services in Western Washington.

This year, our parish goal is \$44,252. Can we achieve it? Yes, I believe we can. Last year, the goal was \$46,471. The pledge and one-time cash was \$60,616 of which \$56,787 was collected and the parish received a rebate of \$10,316. The total participation last year was 35.60% (154 participated out of 441 households). I also believe we can have better participation this year. I would like to invite all registered and non-registered members of the parish to participate in this Appeal. For those who cannot donate due to your financial situation, you may participate by offering prayers for the success of the Appeal. We pray and hope that we will have 100% participation this year.
