



Dear Parishioners and Friends of Sacred Heart of Jesus Parish,

Last Sunday was the educational day of the Annual Catholic Appeal in the Archdiocese of Seattle. John Comerford shared with us the purpose of the Annual Catholic Appeal which supports and serves thousands of people in Western Washington including the senior priests, seminarians, and the needy.

Our Parish goal is \$44,252. The parish collected 24 pledge envelopes last Sunday. The pledge amount was \$10,759 (24 % of goal). The parish does not have the number of parishioners who pledged online or sent their envelopes directly to the Archdiocese. We will update the numbers next Sunday. Every dollar received over the parish goal will return back to our Parish. We will use this returned money for many things: elevator, unfinished basement...etc. For sure your participation in the Annual Catholic Appeal CAN, WILL, and IS MAKING a difference in the life and mission of the Church.

This Sunday is the commitment day of the Annual Catholic Appeal. I would like to thank those who already participated in the Annual Catholic Appeal. For those who have not yet participated, I am asking you to take part in this appeal by giving a dollar a day or an annual gift of \$365.00 or more. We come to Sacred Heart Catholic Church to celebrate the Eucharist together, to pray together, and to do Jesus' mission together.

This Sunday is also the annual World Day of Prayer for vocations: for priesthood, permanent deaconate, religious life (apostolic and monastic), and lay ministry. It is an appropriate occasion for us to highlight the importance of vocations in the life and mission of the Church. It invites us to intensify our prayers for vocation that we have more quality people who commit their life for the life and mission of the Church. We are reminded about our own vocations as husband and wife, priest and religious, and single people. I invite you to reflect on "the Discipline of Service" on the World Day of Prayer for vocations:

'Self-righteous service comes through human effort. True service comes from a relationship with the divine Other deep inside. Self-righteous service is impressed with the "big deal." True service finds it almost impossible to distinguish the small from the large service. Self-righteous service requires external rewards. True service rests contented in hiddenness. Self-righteous service is highly concerned about results. True service is free of the need to calculate results. Self-righteous service picks and chooses whom to serve. True service is indiscriminate in its ministry. Self-righteous service is affected by moods and whims. True service ministers simply and faithfully because there is a need. Self-righteous service is temporary. True service is a life-style. Self-righteous service is without sensitivity. It insists on meeting the need even when to do so would be destructive. True service can withhold the service as freely as perform it. Self-righteous service fractures community. True service, on the other hand, builds community."
