Dear Parishioners and Friends of Sacred Heart Parish,

The parable in today's Gospel seems so uncharacteristic to our American dictum, "A fair day's pay for a fair day's work." Since childhood we've been (rightly) taught that people who work longer and harder deserve better reward. Is it just that the vineyard owner pays all the laborers the same when they have not put out equal amount of time and effort? Such a troublesome question arises when we identify ourselves as those who were hired first and "who bore the day's burden and the heat."

To properly understand this parable, it is wise to note two points: First, those "standing idle in the marketplace" towards the end of the day, are not necessarily due to lack of effort or intention (i.e., lazy). Probably they were still without work, because the strongest would have been hired first. In the time of Jesus, those not hired earlier would have been the widowed, disabled, children, and women too.

Secondly we want God to be generous, but we might expect that God's generosity be determined by human standards, regardless of life circumstances or natural skills. God's standards, however, is always rooted in the goodness of God who, as the vineyard owner, sees ALL laborers as needy and vulnerable. Each of them would need a day's pay to feed their families. Each of them (and us) needs God's kindness and mercy. Let us pray to be able to look each other with the eyes of God, desiring good for all persons.

On that note, I am so proud of our parish for a long history of serving the less fortunate among us. Even with just one short month being here, I either have in my calendar or have visited several social and educational services on our campus, particularly the St. Vincent de Paul food program and the Sacred Heart Shelter for homeless families and women. As time goes on, I will share with you more on these worthy services. Meanwhile, on their behalf, thank you for your generosity and congratulations on living out your Catholic solidarity with the less fortunate.

I have met with the Parish Council twice to plan some exciting future activities, which will be communicated to you soon. And I will meet with the Finance Council this Tuesday. Thank you for getting involved in furthering God's work here. Please keep all of our parish activities in your prayers.
