



Dear Parishioners and Friends of Sacred Heart,

In the gospel Jesus identifies himself as the good shepherd, who leads, nurtures, corrects, and lays down his life to protect his flock of sheep. For Jesus, being a good shepherd, with all its implications, is first of all rooted in his profound understanding of being "a beloved Son of God." Today's gospel offers us – "<u>children of God</u>" (2^{nd} reading) – both comfort and challenge. It is comforting that Jesus the Good Shepherd knows us ... really, really knows each and all of us, inside out. The challenge is that every baptized Christian is a *good shepherd* not only to people entrusted to our care, but also to those that "do not belong to this fold."

The Good Shepherd Sunday is also the *World Day of Prayer for Vocations*. Thank God for women and men in consecrated life (i.e., vowed religious, deacons, priests), and entrust them to the loving care and guidance of the Good Shepherd. Consecrated life is not a "competing" way of life to the vocations of single (or single again) and of marriage. Rather, all vocations are blessed and complimentary to each other. Without one, our faith life as a Christian community is so much poorer. Anyone who feels called to help forming a "Religious Vocations Committee" at Sacred Heart parish? This possibility may also be explored at our upcoming Community Forum.

Following up on last week's bulletin, the Community Forum on the life and future of OUR parish, including the Archbishop's letter on Referendum 74, is scheduled for 6:30 p.m. - 8:00 p.m., on Tuesday, May 8, 2012, in the Fellowship Room. The Pastoral Council is working on plans to celebrate our parish's patron feast of Sacred Heart and Mother of Perpetual Help Novena in June. Please continue holding Sacred Heart parish and each other, as sons and daughters of God, in your daily prayer.

I am deeply grateful to Fr. Pete (Bill Peterson) for his Redemptorist dedication and generosity. He single-handedly earned his keeps for "holding the fort" this past week.
