

Dear Parishioners and Friends of Sacred Heart:

Glad cooler weather is back, after 90's degree heat? Given our A.C.-less building, we continue to keep our church windows (and at times front doors) open during summer days, knowing that traffic and concert noise may distract our worship. Seeing many of us fan to cool ourselves during Mass, my heart goes out to you in prayer. As we enjoy cool weather, please pray for victims of (wild) fires all over the nation. In today's gospel Jesus gets right to the heart of the Eucharist: "The bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world. Unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood you will not have life within you." This very claim of Jesus – as True Flesh! Real Blood! – differentiates Roman Catholic faith from other faith traditions. For us, the consecrated Bread and Wine are not a symbolic representation of Jesus. They ARE indeed Jesus Christ in his LIVING flesh & blood. In receiving the Eucharistic Bread or Wine, we do not simply take in a blessed OBJECT, but are in TOTAL UNION with the PERSON OF JESUS CHRIST. The Eucharist is his self-donating of life for our sake, unites us with him and with one another into a community of consecrated people, and calls us to live out the same self-giving sacrifice for the world.

Our proper attitude in the presence of the consecrated Bread & Wine, whether during or outside of Mass, is genuine appreciation (i.e., adore, meditate) and respectful reverences (i.e., genuflect, bow). If we need to communicate to each other, be mindful to keep our voices appropriately low.

Next Sunday (August 26) plan to join Archbishop Peter Sartain at the 11 a.m. Mass here at Sacred Heart, to honor six Redemptorists, including Fr. Bill Cleary and Fr. Dick Quinn, on their 50th Anniversary of Priestly Ordination. All are invited to a pot-luck luncheon in the freshly painted Mother of Perpetual Help hall (school building) following the Mass. Being a community of Eucharistic people, your presence and any form of contributions (i.e., setting up, cleaning out, food) are greatly valued. Opportunities to sign-up for various needs are available in the front vestibule.

Our deep gratitude to all people – particularly Roberta, Pat, Jerry, Eddie, Nazario, the YAMs – who generously shared so much of their time, creativity, muscle, etc., during this past two weeks to give our parish hall (MPH) a "renewed lease of life."
