

St. Paul (2nd reading) reminds us of the coming of Jesus into our lives in the here and now, daily! At Sacred Heart, to help us "increase and abound in love for one another and for all ... and to be blameless in holiness before our God and Father at the coming of our Lord Jesus," we have several golden opportunities this week:
