

Dear Parishioners and Friends of Sacred Heart,

Today's scripture readings highlight some intense "ups and downs" of human experiences. At times we perhaps feel like the innocent Job – being inflicted with a series of misfortunes, though after having made best effort to live right. We thus fittingly cry out: "Why me?" "Is human life worth living?" In the Gospel, Jesus comes along, not rationalizing the above questions with impersonal answers. Rather, through acts of healing (Simon's mother-in-law), fervent preaching (from one town to another), and ultimately dying on the cross, Jesus enters into the depth of our pain, "holding our hands" and crying with us through the pain ... until a new resurrected life emerges. A "new, healed, renewed" life responds with a heart of service, as exemplified by Simon's mother-in-law. That's the GOOD-NEWS (read: Gospel) which Paul passionately proclaims. That is also your call and my call!

This Sunday marks the 16th World Day for Consecrated Life. In our archdiocese, hundreds of religious men and women such as Redemptorists, Christian Brothers, and Franciscan Sisters serve in a variety of ministries: as parish priests, teachers, health care specialists, retreat work, prison chaplain, and social activists among the poor and marginalized. In the words of Pope Benedict: "... *consecrated men and women are granted to show the primacy of God, passion for the Gospel practiced as a form of life and proclaimed to the poor and lowliest of the earth.*" Please continue your prayers that we in consecrated life be faithful to follow Christ in our service to humanity. Also, to all of you single men and women, pray to become a consecrated religious. Hey, if God can take a "crazy" guy like me, why not you :)

Our parish leadership is planning a five-evening Lenten series called "Catholicism 102." This series will cover a variety of pertinent topics to enrich our spiritual life. Further details will be forthcoming.
