Dear Parishioners and Friends of Sacred Heart.

In today's gospel, Jesus saw the two disciples of John following him, and he asked them, "What are you looking for?" They replied, "Where are you staying?" Jesus then said to them, "Come and you will see" Reflecting on that encounter, Fr. Ron Rolheiser notes that, "At the center of our experience lies a disquiet, a yearning, an ache for something we can never quite name. For what are we longing ultimately? What would satisfy our restless heart?" St. Augustine, after years of inner wrestling, realized our utmost longing is to see the face of God, "You have made us for vourself. Lord, and our hearts are restless until they rest in you!"

But then more questions follow: Who can see the face of God? How is this to be achieved? Jesus answers simply, "Blessed are the pure of heart, they shall see the face of God. (Mt. 5:8) Thus, to work at attaining purity of heart is our ultimate spiritual task, in fact life's ultimate task.

This past Tuesday began a new liturgical season of Ordinary Time. The word "ordinary" in popular usage is often viewed as dull or characterless. This view, spiritually speaking, is nothing further from the truth. Indeed, Ordinary, from its Latin "ordinalis," implies "showing order," or developing character. During the festive Christmas, Jesus Christ reveals the face of God to us. The season of Ordinary Time thus invites us to slowly, calmly, resolutely let our hearts be purified, so that we can really recognize and see the face of God. Just as our physical muscle is better built, strengthened, and toned over a long period of daily "ordinary" meals rather than one festive party, so it is true for spiritual muscle. In short, now is time to put the Gospel into daily practice; now is the time to let our hearts be purified!

This weekend, please welcome Ms. Gillian Parks, who is the director of Sacred Heart shelter for homeless families and children. The shelter is located right behind our church. Gillian, of the Catholic Community Services, will share with us practical ways of living the Gospel.

This Sunday marks the birthday of Dr. Martin L. King, Jr. who shed his life for the gospel value of racial equality and harmony. May we continue to live as sons and daughters of the one common God, and thus sisters and brothers to one another!

Again, Archbishop Sartain invites us to join him for the "Walk for Life" this Tuesday, January 17. Further information is posted on the bulletin board in the front vestibule.
