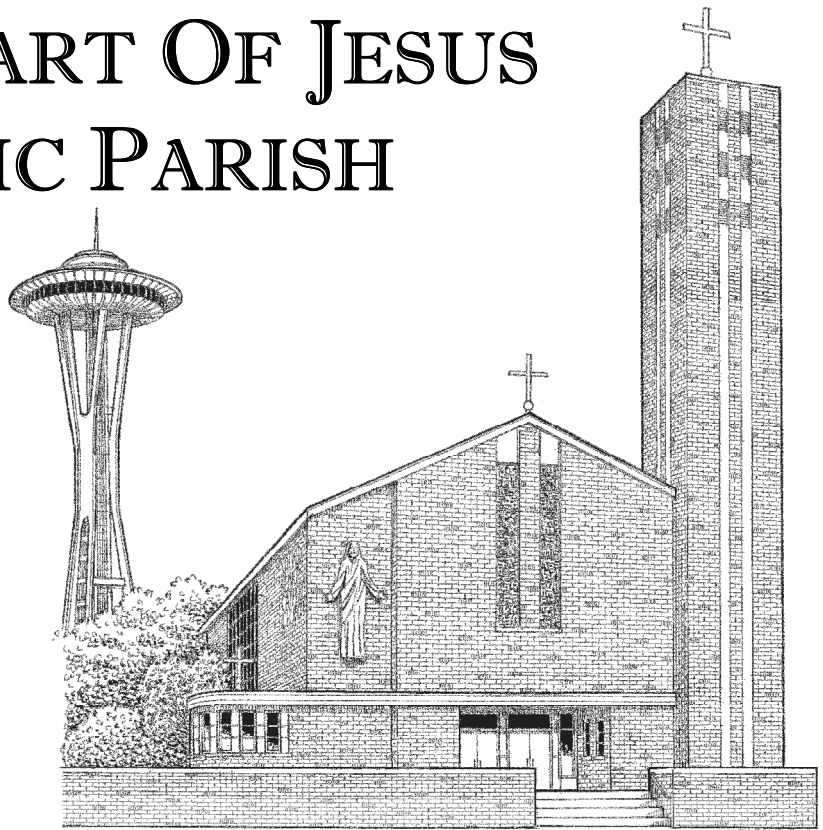
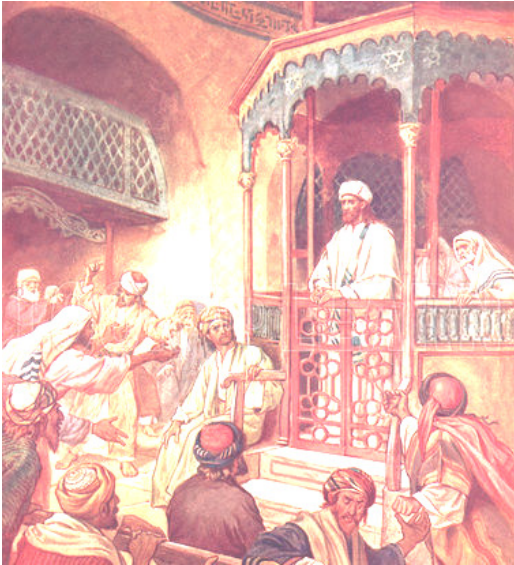

Being once a boat-people from Vietnam, a political refugee in an abandoned island of Indonesia, and now a naturalized citizen/immigrant in the U.S, I am deeply grateful for God's gift of freedom and aware of its values and responsibilities. This past Monday my cousins and I chanced upon the Statue of Liberty at the Alki Beach Park in West Seattle. Near the foot of this statue, a quote from Margaret Meade, a world-renowned anthropologist, inspired my spirit. She said, "A small group of thoughtful people could change the world. Indeed, it's the only thing that ever has." Her statement struck the core of today's scriptures – heeding the words of God-sent prophets and being one.

The prophets, whom God has sent our way to help us best our potentials, come in many shapes and colors: A public figure such as Mother Teresa or Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., or an ordinary friend or next door neighbor. Not only heeding prophetic voices, each baptized Christian is also inherently a prophet. We share the prophetic mission of Christ to bring love and reconciliation to our fragile world. Are we worthy and capable for this mission? Perhaps! Are we ready? May be! Yet, with God's reassuring words to Paul and to us, "my grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness," we can be that "small group of thoughtful people could change the world."

### Anointing of the Sick July 14, Saturday After the 5:30pm Mass



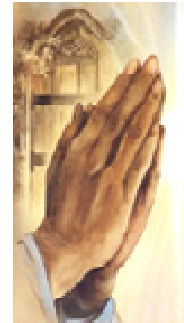

### Vatican Declares Boy's Recovery a "Miracle"

Jake Finkbonner nearly died after contracting a flesh-eating bacterium. His family and friends prayed for a miracle, and now the Vatican has declared that his recovery was considered a miracle by the church.

His mother, Elsa, said Jake was protected by Kateri Tekakwitha, a Mohawk Indian who lived 350 years ago. Kateri had converted to Catholicism and was elevated by the Vatican to "blessed" - one step before sainthood - in 1980. The Finkbonners are Lummi Indian and their family and friends prayed that Kateri would intercede with God for Jake. Blessed Kateri's feast day is July 14.

After Jake was given his last rites, the infection stopped, stunning the doctors. The Rev. Paul Pluth of the Archdiocese of Seattle, says that was the day a friend placed a "relic" of Kateri (a small pendant) on Jake's pillow.

For nearly 5 years, Pluth has headed a tribunal investigating Jake's recovery. After considering testimony by the doctors and others, Pope Benedict XVI has declared it was a miracle, meaning that Kateri is expected to become a saint next year.

Jake, now 11, has fully recovered. He plans to be a plastic surgeon, so he can help children like him.
