Dear Parishioners and Friends of Sacred Heart,

Like any minister of the Eucharist, I too feel deeply honored to hand the Body or Blood of Christ to fellow Catholics – at Mass, at home, or in a hospital. I often smile at the communicants (i.e., recipients of the Consecrated Host). Recently my smile elicited a question, “Father, were you distracted or trying to be friendly?” My answer was, “Neither. I smiled, first and foremost, being joyfully aware of the Blessed Gift that the communicants are about to receive: 100% REAL JESUS! The absolutely mighty God contained himself in a next-to-nothing bread to feed human beings. What love and humility! And seeing each communicant’s profound faith as they accepted the Gift inspired my joy. I was indeed so happy for them! How else, considering this eternal truth: The last two precious gifts Jesus gave to humanity are the Blessed Virgin Mary to be our mother, and the Holy Eucharist as our spiritual food?

On today’s feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, we earthly pilgrims celebrate the abiding presence of Jesus as the Emmanuel – God with us. In the Eucharist, Jesus not only keeps his promise of being with us “always until the end of time,” but also becomes the source of life for us, especially in distressed moments. A priest who spent nine years in hard labor camps once related such a moment: *“A fellow priest-prisoner shared a few drops of wine from his smuggled supply. That night, two other Catholics and I lay on the floor of my cell, and we secretly celebrated Mass with tears of joy. My altar was my blanket, my prison cloth my vestments. But I felt myself at the heart of humanity and of the whole of creation. We offered our lives on the altar with Jesus. We renewed to be Christ-bearers, as Mary was, to fellow prisoners and prison guards.”* [Msgr. Timothy M. Dolan, *Priests of the Third Millennium* (2000), p. 224].

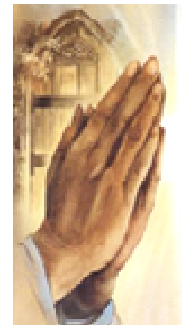

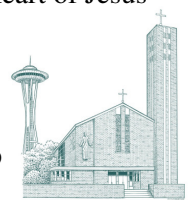
Parish Celebration of the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus June 17 at the 11:00am Mass
