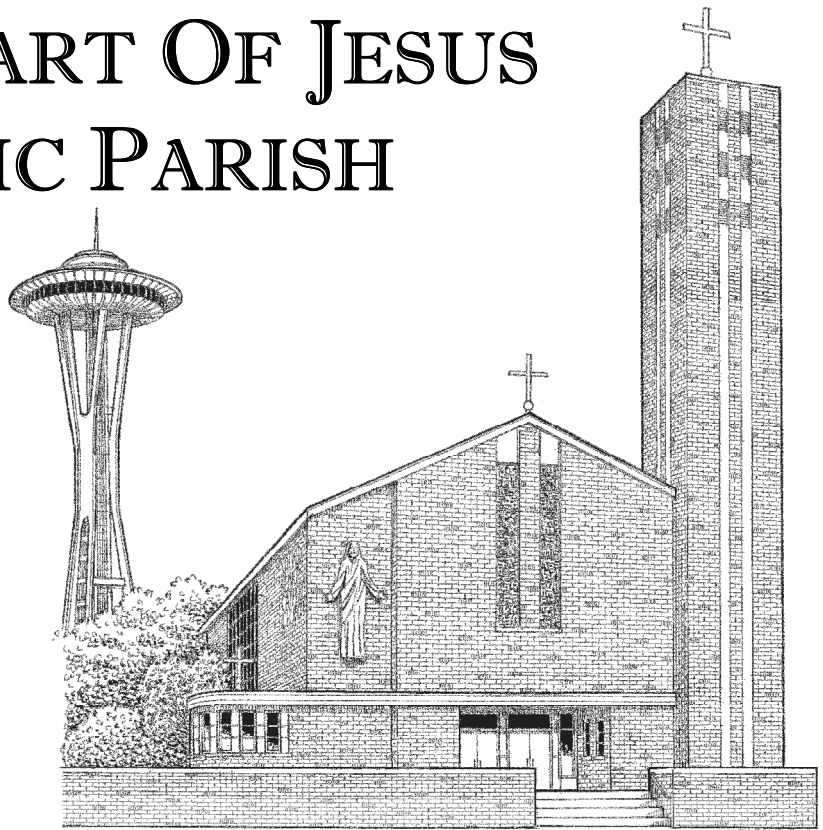

Dear Parishioners and Friends of Sacred Heart,

Today Jesus funnels 613 laws in the Torah into one twin-command of love: Loving God with every fiber of our existence and loving our neighbors as ourselves. This twin law of love is not only the greatest, but also the lens through which our desires, dreams, thoughts, plans, actions, etc., must be viewed. Practicing this twin-command in daily life, as we know, is a sweating challenge. It is viable, even sometimes easier, to love God-neighbor-self as a RESPONSE to God's extravagant, unconditional love for us. Truthfully, nothing you and I can ever do to earn God's love, or stop God from loving us. God loves us – first, freely, always – no matter what!! Jesus exemplifies that. He then reminds us, "Love one another as I have loved you." How do we respond to LOVE, in loving oneself and others, determine our maturity and joy!

Stewardship: God's Gift, Our Response - A Christian Way of Life

In 1884, there was a church in Philadelphia which was so small that people had to buy tickets to attend services. Children were often turned away from Sunday School due to lack of space. One of the children was so upset that she started to secretly save her pennies to help build a larger building. In 1886, the girl became very ill & died. Her parents found 57 cents under her pillow, carefully marked for a new Sunday School building. The pastor told the congregation what happened & offered each of the 57 pennies for sale. Inspired by the girl's generosity, the parishioners raised \$250, which kicked off the fundraising for a new Sunday School building.

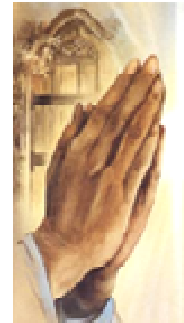
