Dear Parishioners and Friends of Sacred Heart,

Sometime ago while I was on a spiritual pilgrimage, the tour guide took us to visit a 135 years old, beautiful Neo-Gothic-style St. Patrick Cathedral in New York City. Pointing to the decorated Cathedral, he half-jokingly commented, "Every brick of this building got here from the goodness of some poor ladies somewhere." His statement, in light of today's first reading and gospel on the two faith-filled widows, is not a farfetched matter. It indeed reflects an unyielding truth, that is, human goodness and generosity generally comes from grateful hearts, regardless of one's financial means.

Today we begin our annual stewardship consideration. Stewardship, at its core, starts with God and his abundance. Our generous God is the source of infinite riches. All that we are and all that we have is an entrusted gift from our generous God. In gratitude we dedicate a portion of our gifts – time, talent, and money – to advance God's work here on earth.

There are five basic convictions to Stewardship sharing:

- 1) It is a **gift**, to be shared with free will;
- 2) It is **planned**, in prayer and with resolve;
- 3) It is **proportionate** to the gift we have received;
- 4) It is **sacrificial** in that we give from our substance rather than from left over; and
- 5) It is given in **gratitude** for the immense love God has shown us.

This weekend, please welcome Ann Marie Apigo, who will share with us a practical way to live out these faith-filled convictions. May Our Mother of Perpetual Help be our model of grateful generosity to God, and guide us on our discernment!

As I write this letter, I am reminded by the wisdom of a Christian mystic named Meister Eckhart (c. 1260-1327), who said, "*If the only prayer you ever say in your whole life is 'thank you,' that would suffice.*" So, I join you in lifting up our hearts to God, "THANK YOU." And, to each of you and your extended family, THANK YOU.

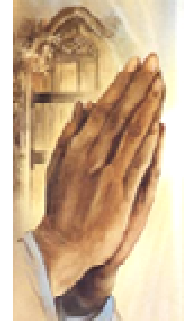
Movie on the Life of Mary in Israel
