

Yet, as the story unfolds, Bartimaeus not only can see, but his gift of seeing further evolves into so much more: a clear vision of life. He gratefully follows Jesus on the way to Jerusalem. "The way" is a biblical codeword for everything that is Jesus, thus the ultimate model of discipleship! Bartimaeus reminds me of a Persian proverb, "A blind person who sees is better than a seeing person who is blind." His faith and gratitude and generosity invites God's gift of salvation, "Your faith has saved you." So, may Jesus unlock your heart and mine, helping us see and sing with the psalmist, "The Lord has done great things for us; we are filled with joy."

Our gracious God has indeed done so much great things for and at Sacred Heart this past year. At all Masses this weekend various members of the Finance Council present our parish's "Annual Pastoral and Fiscal Report." As you review and reflect on the report, know that each and all of you have "incarnated" God's outpouring love at Sacred Heart and beyond so generously and faithfully. I am very grateful for being a part of your faith life, and am sincerely proud of you! Let us keep up the good work.

This coming Thursday (November 1<sup>st</sup>) is the Feast of All Saints. Being a saint means being holy! So, this feast is really about you and me – our origin and our destiny. Our origin, since we are made in the image and likeness of God, who is the source of holiness. Our destiny, as we are reminded by Jesus, "Be holy as your heavenly Father is holy."
