

Rather, it is a heart-to-heart connection with God, as practically expressed in loving and humble service to one another in our daily lives. Religious practices (prayers, Sacraments) are meant to help us deepen our relationship with God and with human family. St. James (2^{nd} reading) further specifies true (i.e., pure, undefiled) religion as "caring for orphans and widows in their affliction and to keep oneself unstained by the world" (i.e., selfishness, arrogance, hatred, deceit).

Last Sunday's 50th anniversary celebration brought in many positive compliments from parishioners and guests alike. In particular, Archbishop J. Peter Sartain conveyed his gratitude for our parish spirit and generosity. On a similar note, I wish to thank everyone again for beautifying the MPH hall, for organizing and ministering at the Mass of thanksgiving, for contributing to and serving at the luncheon, etc. What a holy and joy-filled experience!!! May God bless you, many of whom tirelessly worked behind the scenes, with abundant grace!

This Monday is Labor Day. We thank God for his on-going gift of creation. Human labor to collaborate with God in preserving and enhancing this gift is very sacred and needed. Let us also pray for those who have been suffering with unemployment or are under-employed.

RCIA Sponsors - who, me?

Yes, you! What does it take to be a sponsor for an RCIA candidate? A caring heart and a listening ear as a practicing Catholic! Here is a summary of your role as a sponsor:

- Be a living model of faith. It is critical that a sponsor genuinely practices his/her faith
- **Pray for your candidate and yourself.** Your prayers for your candidates are important as he/she begins a journey of faith towards baptism. Occasionally attend Mass and come to the Sacrament of Reconciliation together.
- Give of your time and share your faith. Every now and then, join in the RCIA sessions with your candidate to share in his/her journey of faith. It takes willingness to share your faith and your time, but trust that God can never be outdone by our generosity.

Candidates for RCIA (Rite of Initiation for Christian Adults)

- Are you a non-Catholic who wants to find out more about the Catholic Faith?
- Do you want to join the Catholic Church through Baptism or Profession of Faith?
- Are you a baptized Catholic but never received religious education, Confirmation, or First Communion?
