Dear Parishioners and Friends of Sacred Heart,

Throughout the gospel of Mark the disciples of Jesus (and thus, all of us) are lead into a "journey of learning" – knowing who Jesus is and what following him means. Today's section reaches the climax, with a personal question posed by Jesus, "who do you say that I am?" (8:29) Up to this point, everyone associated with Jesus, even having been taught and having witnessed miracles after miracles, is quite dense in minds and hearts about him. Ironically, only the devil (evil spirit) has known the answer: "I know who you are – the Holy One of God" (1:24); "Son of the Most High God" (3:11, 5:7).

Today is different. Peter declares for all of us, "You are the Messiah" (Yeahhhh!) But then Peter (and we) sadly lets selfish ambition gets the best of him, by blindly stringing Jesus to behave as our puppet rather than God's life-giving servant. For that, Peter (and we) earns a large bucket of very cold water, "Get behind me, Satan. You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do." Ouch! Ok, let's re-learn a new lesson – humbly trusting, faithfully following Jesus (rather than arrogantly leading our Savior).

To help us deepen true understanding of and devoted service to Jesus Christ, our Church will soon begin "the Year of Faith"—between 11 October 2012 and 24 November 2013. This holy time aims to assist Catholics rediscover, and share with others, God's precious gift of faith.

On growing in faith and sharing it, our RCIA program started last week with five inquirers and three sponsors. There is still room for additional candidates, so please reach out to invite those whom you know could benefit from this gift of faith. Your invitation – an extension of God's love – can change a life. We meet at 7 p.m. on Wednesday in the Fellowship Room. Please call the office if in need any details.

Another great opportunity for growing in faith is through the YAMs-sponsored showing of Catholicism Series. Check out the details in this bulletin and on the flyer in the front vestibule. Mark your calendar. Give yourself this gift of time. Invite your friends.

RCIA Sponsors - who, me?

Yes, you! What does it take to be a sponsor for an RCIA candidate? Here is a summary of your role as a sponsor:

- Be a living model of faith. It is critical that a sponsor genuinely practices his/her faith
- **Pray for your candidate and yourself.** Your prayers for your candidates are important as he/she begins a journey of faith towards baptism. Occasionally attend Mass and come to the Sacrament of Reconciliation together.
- Give of your time and share your faith. Every now and then, join in the RCIA sessions with your candidate to share in his/her journey of faith. It takes willingness to share your faith and your time, but trust that God can never be outdone by our generosity.
