

Would you believe what they did to Jeremiah? Really! Fed up with him and his preaching and God's messages (Jeremiah 38:4-6, 8-10), they threw him into a cistern and he sank into the mud, trapped there until he should die of starvation! He had been warning his people about their continued infidelities which would lead to their downfall. He loved his people but they would not listen to his message of woe and so...the mud pit and death (fortunately he was rescued).

Jesus came with hard messages and challenges that would ignite division from within and without the home: "I have come to set the earth on fire" (Luke 12:49-53). They attempted to throw him, not in a mud pit, but over a cliff one time and do him harm in any number of ways – it finally ended for him on a cross which he knew would happen: "There is a baptism with which I must be baptized, and how great is my anguish until it is accomplished!" Jesus did not want to be rescued for he knew he would rise on his own accord!

Maybe, now, that is really His message: 'You can do it! Rise on your own accord! Don't be hesitant to live! Believe in yourself! Believe in Me! Believe in what I offer you. I won't say it will be easy...they may throw mud at you (mud is easy to wash off). But then don't be afraid to fail either.'

My sister Joan sent me an email, ending with this quote from Elbert Hubbard: "The greatest mistake you can make in life is to be continually fearing you will make one." Well we all make mistakes, fail, sin. Admit it and then turn things around. Jeremiah's people couldn't do this. I think I would rather follow in Jesus' footsteps. And know God likes to keep company with those that try. Try something new. Take a risk in the giving. Better respect and reverence someone.

Nineteen of us went on the Pilgrimage to Our Lady of Perpetual Help Shrine at St. George Byzantine Catholic Church in Olympia – something new for a few of us and – <u>inspirational and delightful</u>! Our Ministry Fair and Sacred Heart's 125th Anniversary Celebrations are nearing – consider stepping up and volunteering. We have a Parish Pot Luck this coming Friday the 23rd – what smile might you influence by the culinary treat you offer?

Respect and reverence never goes out of style. Taken someone for granted lately? Forgot to say 'thank you' or 'I love you' this past week? Could I have helped without being asked? Taken a little time for a thank you note? Come to Church with shoes instead of flip flops; clean though casual wear instead of something quick grabbed and lacking in dignity. Did I frown when I could have smiled; taken instead of giving something of myself or what I have extra to share?

Honor, respect, reverence – possible in so many ways. God bless you in the trying!
