

Dear Parishioners and Friends of Sacred Heart,

In today's gospel, Jesus is given a celebrity reception from hometown folks in Nazareth. His far and wide reputation as a prophetic healer elicits in them native pride and much expectation. Their initial "red-carpet" treatment for Jesus, however, turns into rage, when he insists that his gifts are meant to benefit all – not only for a familiar few but also include "outsiders" of their local community. Jesus implicitly invites them to widen their narrow vision of God's unmerited grace. In the end, unsatisfied by their own perverse expectation of possessing Jesus according to their own terms, they "exile him and even seek his death."

Sr. Ella Allen, SCIC, says it best: "Like the Nazarenes we can sometimes become complacent. Familiarity with the gospel blinds us to its challenges. The call of the poor becomes distant. We ignore injustice that does not touch us directly." Instead of pick and choose Jesus according to our timing, or box him to neatly fit our agenda, may we follow him "to venture beyond the familiar; may we be bold in response to need, generous in compassion, and open to possibility as we continue his mission in our own time and place."

This Sunday is "World Day for Consecrated Life." Please join me in thanking God for the gift of all those who have dedicated their lives in serving God and the world as religious priests, sisters, or brothers. Also, please pray for those who are considering priesthood or consecrated life, and for those who are not considering such a vocation but should be!
