



Today's sacred readings, according to the late Jesuit Fr. Frank Doyle, guide us towards "three interlocking essentials for our Christian living — faith, experience, and apostleship." A meaningful FAITH not only accepts the content of Christ's teachings but involves a total surrender of our authentic self and all we have into God's hands.

Complete surrendering necessitates intimate and abiding EXPERIENCE of the living (i.e., not mummified) and lifegiving God. This implies to be in relationship with Christ, to seek his love and guidance in all circumstances of our life, to make our entire selves available for Christ to love and heal and save the world ... through us (i.e., incarnated love). Yet as they, in various forms, came to know, "BUT, by the grace of God ..." May we then humbly spread Christ's love in his name, under his guidance, for his glory. What will happen? Uh, who knows ... Just trust God! All will be well!

This Wednesday, Lent begins. What a great timing/opportunity to deepen our relationship with Christ, thus with ourselves and with one another. Do so with the Word of God. Our RCIA team, on your behalf, has been preparing 10 adults for the Sacrament of Confirmation and First Eucharist. <u>Next Sunday (Feb.17)</u> they will celebrate the Rite of Sending during the <u>11 a.m. Mass</u>. Please join us at this Mass to send them to Archbishop Sartain for their Rite of Election the following Sunday. These two Rites ready them to be fully incorporated into the Catholic Church at the Easter Vigil.

To deepen our sense of communal unity during liturgical celebrations and to better live responsible stewardship to God-entrusted resources, **our daily 8 a.m. Mass (Monday – Saturday) will be moved to the John Paul II** Adoration Chapel downstairs, starting this <u>Thursday, February 14</u>. The Sacrament of Reconciliation prior to each Mass will be offered in the newly remodeled room next to the chapel.

Fasting and Abstinence

Days of Fasting <u>and</u> Abstinence from meat: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday

Days of Abstinence from meat: all Fridays during Lent

Fasting: allows (a person between 18 and 60 years old) one full meal a day. Two smaller meals, which should not equal to one full meal, are allowed. Liquids are allowed at any time. Fasting is a form of penance which helps us turn away from sin and toward Christ

Abstinence from meat: a penitential practice (of persons 14 years and older) of not eating meat. Fish and shellfish are permitted. To abstain is to remember and unite ourselves with Christ's sacrifice for us

Exemptions: persons suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes and pregnant and nursing women

A "Lectio Divina" Guide by Fr. Jude Siciliano, O.P.

Lectio - reading. The Bible is a living word. Read a few verses slowly, even aloud. Be aware of divine guidance and let yourself be drawn to a particular word or phrase. Dwell with it for a while.

Meditatio – meditation. Engage your faculties by placing yourself in the scene. What do you see? Here? Feel? Think? Etc.

Oratio – prayer. Respond to what you experience with your deepest feelings: joy, praise, sorrow, gratitude etc.

Contemplatio – contemplation. This is what the spiritual writers call "resting in God." Here we suspend all mental and emotional labor and rest in God's arms. Some describe this moment as a "womb" in which the Scripture is reborn and takes flesh and us.
