

10 Things to Remember for Lent

- 1. **Remember the formula**: Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving
- 2. **It's a Time of Prayer**: As we pray, we go on a journey that will bring us closer to Christ.
- 3. **It's a time to fast**: Fasting is a form of penance, which helps us turn away from sin and toward Christ.
- 4. **It's a time to work on discipline**: Instead of giving something up, it can be doing something positive.
- 5. **It's about dying to yourself**: It's about finding aspects of yourself that are less than Christ-like and letting them die.
- Don't do too much: We spend our entire lives growing closer to God. Don't cram it all in one Lenten season.
- 7. **Lent reminds us of our weaknesses**: Recognizing our weaknesses makes us seek God's help with sincerity
- 8. **Be patient with yourself**: God calls us to be patient and to see ourselves as He does: with unconditional love.
- 9. **Reach out in charity**: It's about reaching out to others as a way of sharing God's unconditional love
- 10. **Learn to love like Christ**: Giving of ourselves amidst our suffering and self-denial brings us closer to loving like Christ who suffered unconditionally on the Cross for us.
