

Today's readings remind me of a popular idiom "there is more to (xyz) than meets the eyes," in a positive sense. Jesus is seen in his (hidden) divine nature. Abram (Abraham) is blessed with an abundance of land and descendants, way beyond his dream. The Christians in Philippi learn that their "citizenship is in heaven," instead of being limited by or destined to daily survival on earth!

Every time we celebrate one of the Sacraments, there is plenty more to (God and us) than naked eyes can ever imagine. At Mass, our offerings (i.e., bread, wine, money, prayer) are "transfigured" into Christ's gift of life to feed us, and we as transformed people, in turn, are to channel divine joy and forgiveness to every person or environment we are sent. What an awesome dignity!

Our parish has seen and continues to benefit from various transformations. First, the Adoration Chapel has been a wonderful "home" for the 8 a.m. Mass for over a week. A bit of adjustment is naturally expected by all at Mass. That said, we have experienced so much more good from this "transformation" – responsible use of space/electricity, dignified tribute to the chapel's donors, an intimate community being together to celebrate the Eucharist as a one Body of Christ, etc. Next week, I will announce the new name for the recently remodeled room (basement), along with its possible usages.

A gift of transformation soon coming: A three-day Lenten Parish Mission to celebrate our "Year of Faith" (Saturday/ Sunday, March 16/17 – Tuesday, March 19). Fr. Gary Lauenstein, C.Ss.R. will guide us to grow deeper in our intimate faith with Christ, and thus enjoy its meaning and purpose in our daily living. This grace-filled opportunity only comes every so often, so please mark your calendar and share the news with your family/friends/neighbors.

There has been an increasing "illegal use" of parish parking lot (i.e., extended hours, visitors to Seattle Center, air travelers) in recent months. Such an unlawful usage naturally limits available space for (real) parishioners and guests who wish to go to Mass or to participate in church activities. For common good, a reasonable policy (i.e., universal understanding) is needed to assure parking opportunities for "churchgoers" as well as to prevent public abuses.
