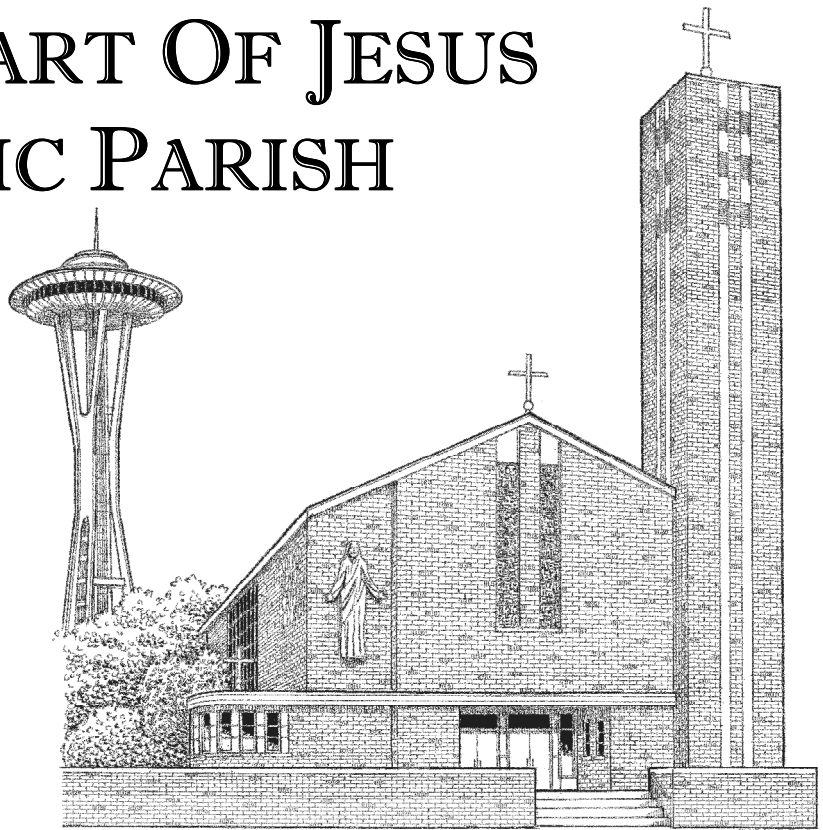

Dear Parishioners and Friends of Sacred Heart,

On Christmas Eve and on the Feast of Epiphany, God reveals himself to us in human bone and flesh as an infant Jesus. Fast forward 30 years later, God reveals himself once again today, as Jesus immerses himself in the water of baptism. Only this time, God's revelation is "grand." It is the first PUBLIC revelation of all Three Persons in the Holy Trinity – Father, Son, and the Holy Spirit. Today God the Father speaks directly to Jesus, affirming his identity, "You are my beloved Son," and also entrusting him with a mission, "with you I am well pleased." The latter phrase, adapted from Isaiah 42:1, refers to "God's suffering servant, whose life purpose is to liberate humanity from the bondage of sin/death and to restore our original dignity/goodness as God's beloved. In the mean time the Holy Spirit descends upon Jesus to empower and to guide his preaching and healing.

Jesus himself willingly and generously embraces his new life identity and purpose, as portrayed in today's first reading, "Comfort, give comfort to my people ... Speak tenderly to Jerusalem (i.e., people in exile), and proclaim to her that her service is at an end, her guilt is expiated ..." and "like a shepherd he feeds his flock; in his arms he gathers the lambs, carrying them in his bosom, and leading the ewes with care."

Today's feast of the Baptism of Jesus brings an end to the Christmas Season and begins a new phase of Ordinary Time. This Sunday onward lets us embrace our own baptismal identity – as God's beloved and as brothers and sisters to one another – and mission, that is, to continue what Jesus did.

Once again, on behalf of Sacred Heart parish and the Redemptorist community, thank you so much for your heart-touching Christmas gestures – prayers, time, gifts, end-of-year donation, hugs, smiles, etc. May the incarnated Child Jesus Christ, through the intercession of the Blessed Mother Mary and St. Joseph, bless each and every one of you for your pure goodness! And may this 2013 be for you and your extended family a year of good health, joy and peace, wisdom and holiness!!

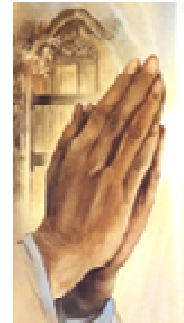

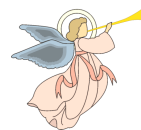
