



Dear Parishioners and Friends of Sacred Heart.

A Buddhist friend, who after having attended Catholic Mass, remarked, "The thing y'all read in there is powerful. It makes sense. By the way, be ready, 'coz it can change you without you even knowing it." What that friend referred to was our Sacred Scriptures being proclaimed at Mass. His insightful observation echoes what the ancient Israelites (first reading), experienced when the Word of God was read to them. They "listened attentively," realizing that "your words, Lord, are Spirit and life" (psalm response). Afterward, they "wept." Whether out of joy or repentance or gratitude, the people felt so alive and hope-filled, that they rebuilt the ruined city of Jerusalem back to its life and glory!

We are extremely blessed. Unlike our ancestors, a written Bible is available for us nowadays. If ancient people were spiritually energized by God's inspired words being read occasionally, how more enriched your and my spiritual life can be with a Bible available 24/7 years around? For a "rich" life, regularly read the Bible; meditate on it; let it slowly seep into our heart, and flow out into daily life. Hearing the Words of God only at Sunday Mass is insufficient for any Catholic who wishes to be spiritually mature. St. Jerome once reminded us, "Ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ." A Redemptorist once unlocked the secret of the acronym B.I.B.L.E. to mean "Basic Information Before Leaving Earth." So, get to know the mind and heart and soul of God now. It will be easier to recognize God later.

In our weekly bulletin, we list the "daily readings" for us to realistically portion our day for spiritual enrichment. Depending on one's schedule, check out one or two or all three sections as listed. The key is to pray with the Bible ... regularly, even daily. In this Year of Faith, and as we begin this calendar year, it is great occasion to begin. And be amazed by its beauty.

Our annual parish Volunteer Dinner is around the corner. Please check in this bulletin for more details.

To help all of us celebrate the "Year of Faith," Sacred Heart will host a Lenten Parish Mission from Sunday, March 17 through Wednesday, March 20, 2013. Fr. Gary Lauenstein, C.Ss.R. (a spiritual master from Toronto, Canada) has kindly agreed to guide us during these days. It will be a grace-filled opportunity for us, to grow deeper in our intimate relationship with Christ and with one another. More details on the mission will be forthcoming. Since such an opportunity only comes every so often, please mark your calendar and share the news with your family/friends/neighbors.
