



His deep faith, humility, integrity, universal love, etc., is a great example for all of us as we continue our journey of Lent.

Thank God for Pope [Emeritus] Benedict's life and his many years of service to the Church. Please continue praying that God generously bless him with good health, deep joy, and abiding peace! Meanwhile, pray to the Holy Spirit for all eligible-voting Cardinals, as they enter into a process of discernment and voting for a new Pope to lead us in the way of Christ to God. May our Blessed Virgin Mary intercede for the Roman Catholic Church during this time of transition!

On Mary, I am pleased to announce the new name, among many worthy names submitted, for the remodeled room downstairs: "Visitation" [Mary & Elizabeth]. Rational: Mary brings Jesus Christ and his joy of salvation to Elizabeth and her family. Elizabeth in turn blesses the pregnant Mary as the mother of our Savior. "Visitation" is naturally connected to "Fellowship," the room next door. A mutually loving visit gives birth to or increases meaningful fellowship, through which Jesus Christ is alive, in our midst.

This room is designed for multi-purposes: Weekday Sacrament of Reconciliation, group meetings, child care during Mass, recreation/reception [fellowship room], bridal preparation room for weddings, etc.

To help all of us celebrate a meaningful Holy Week this year, the Liturgy Committee has been actively planning, and is currently in need of volunteers for various activities (i.e., lectors, feet washing). Queen Anne Food Bank at Sacred Heart Celebrates its First Year Anniversary

Highlights:

- The Sack Lunch Program is open mornings from Monday through Friday.
- In the past year, the Food Bank distributed 44,878 sandwiches
- The Food Bank is open every Thursday afternoon and distributes groceries to low income residents in four Belltown and Queen Anne zip codes: 98109, 98119, 98101, and 98121
- Each client receives 40 lbs of fresh produce, meat, and staples every week
- Metropolitan Market, QFC, Safeway, Starbucks, Ten Mercer, Kaspar's Catering, Pike Brewing Company, and Caffe Ladro are some of the local companies that support us weekly with food donations
- There are 56 active volunteers at the Food Bank.
 The age range of the volunteers is between 4 to 89 years old.
