

Before I left QFC I searched the isles trying to meet up with the man who was so gracious to acknowledge me. He had left. In his honor, I will try to do better. Honor someone this week by letting go of a narrow perspective and allowing yourself to be embraced by the attention of another as you graciously recognize them.


