

Why is a car's windshield so large and the rear view mirror so small? Because our past is not as important as our future; thus, look ahead and move on.

Old friends are gold! New friends are diamond! If you get a diamond, don't forget the gold! Because to hold a diamond, you always need a base of gold!

Often when we lose hope and think this is the end, God smiles from above and cautions, "Take a deep breath and relax, this is only a bend in the road, not the end of it."

When God solves your problems, you have faith in His abilities; when God doesn't solve your problems He is extending support for your abilities -- which He provided.

A blind person asked Moses, "Can there be anything worse than losing eye sight?" He replied: "Yes, losing your vision!"

When you pray for others, God listens to you and blesses them. Sometimes, when you are safe and happy, remember someone has prayed for you.

We have so much to be proud of this past fiscal year, as Ben Bauman thankfully shared in last Sunday's report – you are the reason for this! And our Church sanctuary is brighter today due to the hard work and volunteered hours of John Todd and Gerry Guinasso who replaced many of the long burnt-out lights on the ceiling beams.
