God bless you!

You have heard of Noah, right? No, I do not mean the biblical fellow who built an ark to save a few of his family from the great flood. I mean Noah, the non-releasable, one-legged homing pigeon/rock dove at a rehab center called the Wild Rose Rescue Ranch - home, now, of Noah.

Jesus talks about Noah, the pigeon, in the gospel passage today – well, OK, indirectly, I admit. Jesus uses dramatic language to make a point: *We must use well the gifts we have received – use our gifts as they should be used!* He wants us to do more than the minimum that is commanded. So Jesus and Noah, a one-legged pigeon? You are curious. Right? I know you are. C’mon, now, admit it. Well, it intrigued me as well!

Bob and Georganne Lenham, of Wild Rose Rescue Ranch in Texas, tell the story. Noah is a one-legged pigeon and one day a litter of five 6 day-old bunnies were brought in – these bunnies, and their mother, attacked by a dog and now orphaned. Two did not survive and the remaining three were not doing very well. Noah kept going over to the bunny cage and looking in, even sleeping in front of the door to the cage.

Then there were only two bunnies in the cage – one little bunny had crawled through the cage and settled under Noah’s wing, sound asleep. And soon they are all together, now under Noah’s wings and doing great as they snuggle. When one of them moves or they start sticking out here and there, he gently pushes them back under his wings with his beak. The bunnies are fed by staff, but Noah provides the cooing and warmth they also deserve. And although bunnies seem to be his favorite, Noah helps out with many rescue babies at the Wild Rose Rescue Ranch – a soft-feathered nurturer, cuddling and snuggling with “coos” as if singing them to sleep with a lullaby.

Here is nature doing the unexpected. Jesus asks us to go beyond what we have been commanded to do; to go beyond the expected, in our love for one another, and offer the unexpected! He wants us to do more than the minimum that is commanded. So, what more can you do today to go beyond what is required to help others? Or to help yourself?

The RCIA program, as Father Binh earlier mentioned, “Is a best kept secret of our Catholic faith, especially for spiritual seekers.” Have you thought about attending to enhance and strengthen your faith or risked encouraging another to attend? Embrace them with your wings! October 10th, Thursday, our own Sacred Heart Shelter, benefiting families experiencing homelessness, is sponsoring Soupline 2013 (flyers available in the vestibule) – will you be there to help out by attending, or going beyond the minimum and offering the unexpected?

You and I are above the pigeons and are at the top of God’s creative list. Prove yourself and embrace others and yourself in only the unexpected ways you can do. If nature can do the unexpected, why can’t we? God bless you!

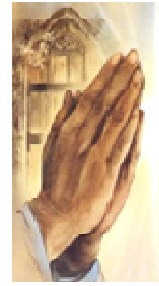
