Is there a picture in your family album you wish would remain unseen? I have a few and several of them are baby pictures – Oh, my parents loved them but I did not care for the pose, or facial expression, or the fact that I was wearing my birthday suit. I recently came across a picture of our universe and for all practical reasons it was an image when our universe was just a toddler and only about 600 million years after the Big Bang when many believe God began it all.
