

Our parishioners and volunteers regularly visit and spiritually care for the homebound; we feed transient folks through our sack-lunch and food bank service; we partner with the Catholic Charities and D.E.S.C. to shelter displaced families and to provide year-round overnight lodging for homeless men, etc. Yes, we try to practice what we believe, by serving Christ in the less fortunate, even with limited means! And yes, your faith generosity inspires me and fills me with hope. I am grateful and hopeful.

Today's sacred readings are plain and clear: Actively share one's riches (i.e., money, mercy, friendship, talents) with the poor/the outcast/the vulnerable – locally and globally; assist them, through our votes on political or social policies, to close their undignified gap of life condition. If the scriptures stir up a twinge of discomfort, even guilt, in our soul, it implies that our conscience is still "alive." For our conscience and heart to grow healthily, Paul's advice is wonderful: "Tell the rich ...not to be proud and not to rely on so uncertain a thing as wealth but rather on God, who richly provides us with all things for our enjoyment. Tell them to do good, to be rich in good works, to be generous, ready to share, thus accumulating as treasure a good foundation for the future, so as to win the life that is true life." (1 Timothy 6)

A big gratitude to all who organized and participated in the parish "Ministry Fair" last week. We are grateful for all who signed up to share your time and talents through various ministries at Sacred Heart.


